Conference on global climate change to take place at KU- The School of Law at the University of Kansas will host "Facts, Ideas and U.S. Climate Change Policy — A Conference on Climate Change" from 8:30 a.m. to noon Saturday, Oct. 20, at 104 Green Hall. The conference is open to the public. The event will bring together academics with expertise in law, economics, philosophy and the natural sciences to explore ongoing cutting edge research on the causes, nature and extent of global climate change. The natural scientists will address what each of their disciplines has already learned about climate change and what the remaining uncertainties are. Based on this information, the social scientists will present a policy-based set of recommendations for the development of future U.S. climate change policy. The panelists include a diplomat who helped negotiate Japanese participation in the Kyoto Protocol.
